Franklin county is shamefully deficient in Fruit. It has excellent soil for every variety of apples, peaches, cherries, pears, grapes, &c., and yet scarcely one farm in treaty has even a respectable orchard much loss a well cultivated assortment of the delicious fruits which invite the favor of the husbandman. Some of our low, beavy limestone lands are not well adapted to peaches, grapes and the other more delicate fruits; but even such soil will well repay the owner for the careful planting and culture of apples, cherries and pears. It will require a little more care and labor in setting the trees out so that the heavy clay does not arrest the properses of their roots and thin destroy that the tecomyt upon which a great or less variety of fruit cannot be grown to pay well for the labor and outlay.

But while we have some lands which require more than ordinary labor to cultivate fruit successfully, three-fourths of the farms in this countly have land that is admirably adapted to fruit. There are scores of thin alate farms in the western and northern part of the county which would raise the very best of peaches, grapes, pears, cherries and apples, and ten acrea of the farms in the county have land that is admirably adapted to fruit. Those who have but a spare corner shout the house or stable should plant a vine in it.
