Speaking of the city of Petersburg, the Alexandria Sentinel of the 6th says: "That Democratic city gave Mr. Breckinridge but three votes upon Douglas."

We have heard enough of it. If the editor of the Sentinel and those who voted with him, had shown the same devotion to a sense of right and justice for the Union and the Constitution, that marked the action of the friends of Judge Douglas, the country would not now be on the verge of ruin.

When the Legislature of that State will throw Mr. Green overboard, this writer's triumph will be complete. The official vote of the State stands—Douglas, 31,214; Lincoln, 27,070; Breckinridge, 27,688.

Several of the Breckinridge papers in this State condemn the action of their six electors, who resigned their places and thus nullified the will of the people.

The Washington correspondent of the New York Herald, says it is quite probable a compromise will be reached.

The Richmond Whig says: "A very distinguished citizen of a Northern State, in a private letter to the editor of this paper, says: 'The disunion is opening the eyes of our people to the fact that they have been deceived. You will soon see the reaction.'

The New York Herald estimates a disunion through the country in the next six weeks, unless, wool, corn, State securities, railroad and bank stocks, sugar, real estate and other property, are valued at millions of dollars.
