General News.

The Congress Observer relates the name of Mr. John M. Battle as United States Senator from Va. Garrett Davis has left Washington, "assured" that the troops will be withdrawn from Kentucky.

A negro minister from Georgetown was arrested in Washington, on Friday morning, for stealing eight hams, one shoulder and a bag of sweet potatoes.

A newspaper, the Clarksville (Tennessee) Chronicle, has been suppressed by the military authorities, because they did not approve of the tone of its editorial articles.

The story about Secretary Seward notifying the British Government relative to Fesian movements is not credited in Washington by those presumed to be in a position to give an unequivocal denial.

The Nashville Banner has a story to the effect that Wm. L. Yancey, died of spine disease, brought on by injuries received in a personal encounter with Ben. Hill, of Ga., in a secret session of the Confederate Senate. This is a mistake.

The N. Y. Express states that the letter which lately won the rounds of the papers, purporting to be from the late President Lincoln to the late Gen. Wadsworth, expressing opinions in favor of negro suffrage, was a forged or forged letter.

A remarkable and significant feature of the election in Connecticut on Monday, was the unanimity of the soldiers' vote. The returned veterans of the war, bronzed in years of toilsome marches and scoured battles, voted nearly unanimously against the proposition for negro suffrage.

An old citizen of Leavenworth, just from Salt Lake, reports trouble brewing between the Mormons and the United States authorities. The former are said to feel that the Gentiles are encroaching on their rights by settling in their midst and saying hard things of their favorite practice—polygamy.

Rev. Robert Castleman, a well known member of the Protestant Episcopal Church, was brutally murdered on Wednesday night week, near Gaston, N. C. The perpetrator of the deed was not identified. The deceased was widely known and much beloved in Virginia.

There is but little news of importance from South America. In Peru the rebels were still holding out with more or less vigor. It is still a very doubtful question as to which party will be finally successful, through matters generally looked a little more favorable for the Government. The rebels still hold the Chincha Islands, but allow American, English and French vessels to load under their regular charters.

Col. Sells has made an important treaty with the Osage Indians, which provides for the cession of a million acres of land, Government to pay the sum of \$600,000. Two millions more are also offered, which are to be sold, in trust, for the benefit of the Indians. These lands are all in Kansas, and the rights of the settlers are fully protected by the treaty.

A dispatch from Philadelphia states that quite a sensation was produced in one of their city churches or Sunday last, by the appearance, in the chancel of the Rev. Dr. Dooley Whistler, a clergyman of "secess proclivities," to minister in celebrating the Holy Communion service, which was the signal for a large portion of the congregation to leave the Church in disgust.

It is evident that that church has a good deal of piety to boast of!

The first session since the close of the war of the United States District Court, Judge Underwood presiding, convened Monday week in Alexandria, Va. The District Attorney, L. H. Chandler, made a very eloquent and forcible speech, urging upon the Court a liberal policy in treating the large number of confiscation cases upon the dockets. The Judge, before adjournment, made the following decision:

"Ordered, That in all cases where pardons have been granted, and where the amnesty oath has been taken, save as to those under the President's proclamation, all suits for property under the confiscation law are dismissed upon payment of costs."

A large number of citizens interposed, under this ruling were present in court, and immediately went forward and paid the costs that had accrued upon suits begun against them.
