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Some of the fruits of Lincoln's Election. The New York Tribune, strange as the remark may seem, has more honesty—perhaps the better word would be modesty—than most of its contemporaries in the matter of Lincoln.

The Tribune of the 17th last, contained the language of the Hon. Henry B. Stanton, recently delivered at Middletown. This speech is full of abolitionisms and bromides and of hatred towards the South.

But it is not my purpose to stop now to repeat the words of the Hon. Henry B. Stanton, which will furnish materials for two of the best and fullest chapters in the annals of the Republic. Suffice it say that they are dignified and humane; they are temperate and judicious; they are full of the spirit of the age.

Again— A Republican Administration will break up the wide-spread conspiracy, ramifying all through the country, to wrest the Territories from foreign nations, and to give the States an opportunity to give the people to the yamming chain which is about to engulf us.

The chief conspirators are misanthropes and Senators of the Calhoun school of politicians. Their books are the drawing-room of the States. The active agents in the conspiracy are the despots of our cities, led by such fabricators as Lopez and Walker.

These "peaceable travelers" in the South, who are just about the penitentiary Walker, the Administration of Lincoln, while that of Huberman, will not trouble foreign powers to arrest and punish American sinners, but will itself seize and imprison or hang every course who will fight upon the soil of the Republic.

When Abraham Lincoln is commander-in-chief of the Army and Navy of the Republic, the able citizens will be protected in the exercise of their rights both in the Army and in the State, and cannot be taken by surprise.

There are to be some of the fruits of Black Republicanism when Lincoln is "Lord" of the Republic, and such is the term used by the Black Republican "conservationist."

POLITICAL MATTERS.

What Have the Republicans Done? In Massachusetts they have enfranchised negroes and disfranchised all foreign-born white men.

In New York they have given negroes the right of suffrage.

In Ohio, in 1860, Mr. Monroe, a Republican member of the Legislature, introduced a resolution to strike the word "white" from the Constitution of the State.

The Republican Supreme Court of Ohio says that mulatto suffrage is Constitutional, and the Republican Legislature says that while they are in power it shall consist of no Constitution.

The Republican Supreme Court of Ohio has decided that mulattoes are "white citizens of the United States," and have a right to vote, hold office, and sit on juries.

When the Democracy in the last Ohio Legislature proposed an amendment to the Constitution which would effectually prevent negro suffrage, the Republican majority defeated the amendment.

In Cleveland, the Republican Board of Education compel white children to sit side by side with negroes—only the members of the Board say that the white society's children should sit beside a negro than beside a frizzle-headed Irishman or a bare-headed Dane.

The Republicans in one of the townships in Logan county, Ohio, have elected a negro to a township office.

The Cleveland Herald, a sound Republican paper, says: "We unhesitatingly assert that seven tenths of the foreigners that land on our shores have less intelligence than full-blooded Africans."

The Greensburg (Tennessee) Democrat says—James Britton, Jr., Douglas supporter for this (the 1st) district, declines, and exports Brockbridge and Lane. He makes a speech at the Court House to-day, giving his reasons for so doing.

It is well known that he had submitted a proposition to both the Douglas and Breckinridge electors to compromise, and run for Democratic ticket in Tennessee. His proposition was a fair and honest one. It would give Mr. Douglas, a chance for Tennessee where he has no voters. It was rejected by the Douglas electors, and accepted by all the Breckinridge electors in the State; Mr. Breckinridge declines, and will support Mr. Breckinridge according to his propensity.

Manchester. The Democratic "bucket meeting" at Florence, near Georgetown, must have been a glorious success. The speaker, Mr. Breckinridge, was so well received that he was almost literally hoarse.

This paper admits that there was from three thousand to thirty-five hundred present, and the highest figure here mentioned may, therefore, probably be deemed to arrive at the true number.

Maryland. The State Democratic Executive Committee of Maryland have issued an Address, in which they say the disintegration of the American party at Baltimore, as shown by the result of the recent Mayor's election, has left the friends of Mr. Bell with no chance or hope of carrying the State. The Douglas party in Maryland is very small.

Virginia. We are assured that the Norfolk Argus, by gentlemen from that section of the State, that Breckinridge will gain 1,000 on Letcher's vote in the district of Virginia. No party in the district, and many a single have declared for Breckinridge and Lane.

Texas. The Democratic majority for Treasurer in the late Texas election was 25,000. Some of the papers predict 30,000 for Breckinridge, and one, Hon. John H. Reagan is stamping vigorously for these candidates.
