beaver, we were ordered to the Junction, and were taken under a tree and then kept for several hours. Our wounds were, in the meantime, without attention, and must have suffered for want of water. About twelve o'clock at night we were allowed to return to the hospital, and to resume our attention to the wounded, six of whom died in the course of the night. Whilst in the blacksmith shop, on Monday, Lieutenant Devens of the 11th North Carolina requested me to headgear his arms. I told him I had not time just then, to visit and I would return. He laid down, and requested me, should he fall asleep, to wake him when I was ready. In the morning, when I was ready, I forgot him, and did not return till next day, when I found him a corpse. His attitude riveted my attention—it was the posture of a pugilist ready to receive and give a blow.

Attention to the Wounded. On Tuesday, we gathered our horses, thrown away by our troops in their retreat, and from them obtained a supply of provisions. Six of the surgeons returned from Manassas Junction, having given their parole, and at once resumed the care of the wounded of their respective regiments. In the meantime, a number of prisoners, of various regiments had been brought in, and an order was given that all of them should be removed to Richwood via the Junction. I was chosen by Dr. Pageant to take charge of the hospital, and was authorized to select men to assist me in my duties. Twelve of our men died during Tuesday night.

How He Was Taken Prisoner.

I was taken prisoner at half-past five o'clock, P. M., Sunday, July 21st, 1861, by a number of cavalry, who surrounded me and compelled me to surrender, as I was endeavoring to join my regiment, then in retreat from the field. I was conducted back to Sedley Church, from which, at the time of my capture, I was returning to my regiment having temporarily left it to assist a wounded comrade to the Church, to be placed under the care of the Surgeons. Upon my arrival at the church, which our surgeons had converted into a hospital, I was selected by Dr. Pageant to assist in the amputation of limbs.

The Dead and Wounded.

On Monday, July 23, all of the physicians and surgeons, twelve in number, were removed to Manassas Junction, myself and other prisoners being left in care of the staff and wounded.

FREDERICK, August 5. Mr. Wallis, from the Committee on Federal Relations, submitted a lengthy and able report upon the Memorial of the Police Commissioners of Baltimore, accompanied by the following preamble and resolutions:— Whereas, The military authorities of the Government of the United States, in Baltimore, have assumed to remove from office the Marshal of Police of that city, an officer of the State of Maryland, and to appoint his successor; and have further assumed to displace from office the Board of Police of Baltimore, a body created by high powers by the State of Maryland, for the protection of its citizens, and have actually put an end, by force, to the exercise of said Board of the lawful and important functions, and have appointed sundry individuals, in large numbers, to govern said city as police, in contempt of the constitutional rights of the State of Maryland, and in open violation of the laws; and

Limits of the Sea in Ancient Times.

Geologists have ascertained the remarkable fact that in earlier ages the ocean covered a much larger surface than it does at present; but the line of the old sea coast is not so easy to ascertain. M. Marcel de Sarrazin, a well known geologist, points out a circumstance which naturally appears in many cases, to afford a satisfactory clue to the mystery. It is well known that there are certain kinds of molluscs which inhabit the sea in every direction, and with such accuracy as to make them in the ocean fall to pieces. M. Marcel de Sarrazin, in the neighborhood of Paris, when the necessary information is well developed, in examining the effects of these molluscs, remarked certain perforations, resembling the impressions of shells, on the southern side of the mountain rising parallel to the Mediterranean. On the northern side, which is turned away from the sea, no such marks are to be seen. Now consider that these perforations are unquestionably the work of the molluscs in question, and that these creatures only inhabit the coast. M. Marcel de Sarrazin arrived at the very allowable conclusion that the sea formerly reached the level of these perforations. In continuing his researches, he has been enabled to ascertain by an analogous line of argument, that the sea formerly reached to the height of the Nollis, in the Department of the Haras, where he has found several marine polyptera of the genus Atrypa perforated like the stratum into which they are attached.

The New Party Organized by the Old Flag.

We observe that an effort is being made in different quarters in this State, and in the neighboring States, to organize a new party, under the name of the "Union party."

The leaders in this movement are either the avowed and bitter enemies of the Democratic party, or its secret foes, who have for years past been engaged in the work of disorganization.

It is not surprising that they should endeavor to conceal their transgressions under the name of a new organization; for that would be characteristic of a party which changes its name and its principles periodically.

The last and only hope of the country is in the maintenance of the Democratic organization. Bitter experience has already sickened a people of Republican domination.

Democracy is now asked to rescue the Republican party from the swift destruction to which it is rushing, and to contribute to its perpetuity by uniting with its leaders in the formation of a new party based upon pre-Union devotion to the Union.

The Democracy of Ohio.

The resolutions adopted at the Democratic Convention at Hamilton, Butler county, Ohio, on the 21 of the present month, are among the most determined we have seen in their opposition to the present Administration.

Whereas, the two hundred and ten thousand (210,000) Democrats of Ohio, at their last State Convention refused to entertain the idea of seceding from the Union; and

Resolved, that the President of the United States, in exercising the executive, legislative and judicial powers of the Government, by declaring war, raising armies, providing armies, establishing blockades, expending money without appropriation by law, suspending the privilege of the writ of habeas corpus, proclaiming martial law, increasing the regular army and navy, and by authorizing the subversive military officers to prescribe special regulations for the military service.

Resolved, That the incapacity of the party which has clamored to power over the fragments of a nation is made glaringly apparent when the Republican Congress has no rebuke to offer for its violation of the Constitution.

Resolved, That our able representative in Congress, the Hon. C. L. Vallandigham, for his recent fratricidal exposure of the violations of the Constitution by the present Administration deserves the warmest commendations, not only of his immediate constituents, but of the friends of free and constitutional government everywhere.

Resolved, That we receive with abhorrence the proposal to affiliate with the party in this State which has so lately pretended to abandon its organization, and that we expect the State Central Committee to reject every overture from that quarter with silent contempt.

Interesting from Washington.

Well authenticated rumors have reached the city that during last night a skirmish took place near the Federal lines on the Virginia side of the Potomac.

The War Department is overrun with would-be colonels and captains, who, having succeeded in raising regiments or companies, are anxious to have their commissions by the Government.

There was a slight skirmish last night near Falls Church, Virginia, between several Federal and Rebel pickets. It is believed that a number of the Rebels were killed. Two of our men were wounded.

Very accurate observation has not disclosed any Rebel troops within ten miles of Alexandria.

The Incident at Wheeling.

I was under the impression, when first I saw that we are maintaining a strict blockade, but matters have come to light which disprove it.

Are our officers true to the Stars and Stripes? Are they patriotic? Strange things have happened here of late. Some days since our British Majesty's gunboat Kearsage came alongside, and her captain boarded us, conferred with Captain Meyer, and in about half an hour returned to his ship and went away, apparently standing further down the coast.

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Return of the Fleet.

On Saturday, rumors were abundant at Cairo as usual, of threatening attacks on Bird's Point. The vessel, the "John Bull," had no company on board.

On Saturday afternoon, at 8 o'clock, the Capt. of the "John Bull," who was in command of the vessel, was informed by the breaking of a shaft on her steam engine, that she was unable to proceed.

The State Convention resumed yesterday and today. The first business transacted was the appointment of a committee on the address of the State.

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Interesting from New York.

The Steamer Columbia arrived at this port this afternoon with Havana dates to the 13th inst.

The Captain-General of Cuba is absent at Santiago taking formal possession of the Dominican territory for the Spanish crown.

The Havana markets were active. Sugar quoted at 12 1/2 cents per lb. (1861) was steady, freight dull; no business was offering for American vessels.
