Mr. Davis tries to justify his invasion of Kentucky by saying that the Confederate torces "were marched into that State to repel the enemy and prevent their occupation of certain strategic points which would have given them great advantages in the contest." He charges it as a crime against the United States, that "they have refused to acknowledge Kentucky's right to be neutral." We answer that Kentucky herself edge nentucky argin to be neutral. We answer that Kentucky herself has neither claimed a right nor expressed a desire to be neutral. The will of herpeople has been expressed through the ballot box, and they will of her people has been expressed through the ballot box, and they have declared most emphatically for the Union. The Federal forces are there in support of the expressed desire of the people of Kentucky to remain in the Union, whilst the contederate forces are there in support of a cause which the people have repudiated. The posting of United States troops in Kentucky was clearly a lawful occupation of her soil, whilst the marching of confederate troops there was just as clearly, an unlawful invasion of it. Mr. Davis says the confederates were animated "by a desire to aid the people of Kentucky," and that "it was never intended by the confederate government to conquer or coerce them." Then why is the confederate army kept on the soil of Kentucky, after a vast majority of her people have declared sgainst secession? It looks as if the confederates had taken a lesson from Stevens and Burrowea, and resolved to "treat the (Kentucky) selection as if the days repeated. to "treat the (Kentucky) election as if it had never been held." The Democracy of Pennsylvania refused to work by that rule in 1888 and they will not agree to work by it

On the subject of State neutrality, we may remark that there can be no such thing. A State that attempts to be neutral raises at once the stan-dard of rebellion. It can't be neudard of rebellion. It can toe neu-tral so long as it performs its con-stitutional obligations, and when-ever it refuses to perform them, it is in open rebellion. Neutrality is secession, and until the right of sesecession, and until the right of secession is admitted, the right to be neutral must be denied. If, therefore, Kentucky had declared for neutrality by the unanimous voice of her people, that would have been no valid reason for refraining from posting United States troops within her limits. As she has declared for the Union by an overwhelming vote, it is beyond dispute that the federal government is aiding her federal government is aiding her people and that the confederate government is attempting to coerce
