The Constitution of the United States.

We the people of the United States, in order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, insure domestic Tranquillity, provide for the common defence, promote the general welfare, and secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

Article I. Section 1. All legislative powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives. Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen every second year by the people of the several States...

Section 3. The Senate shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen by the Legislature thereof, for six years; and each Senator shall have the qualifications of Representatives. Section 4. Representatives and Senators shall have certain privileges and immunities...

Section 5. Representatives and Senators shall be sworn or affirmed before they take the Oath of Office. Section 6. The House of Representatives shall choose their Speaker and other Officers; and shall have the sole Power of Impeachment. Section 7. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive Power of trying all Impeachments...

Section 8. The Congress shall have the Power to lay and collect Taxes, Duties, Imposts and Excises, to regulate Commerce with foreign Nations, to borrow Money on the Credit of the United States, to define and punish Crimes against the Law of Nations...

Section 9. The Privilege of the Writ of Habeas Corpus shall not be suspended, unless when in Cases of Rebellion or Invasion the public Safety may require it. Section 10. No State shall enter into any Treaty, Alliance, or Confederation with a foreign Power...

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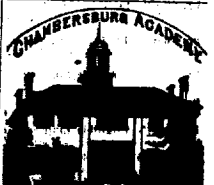

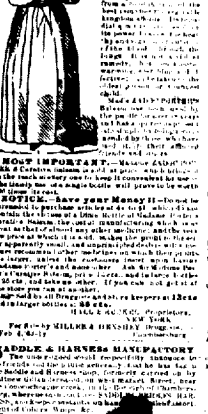
